“STEINKE” is an occupational surname for a stone cutter. It is derived from the Old German word ‘stein’, meaning stone. It may be a topographical name also, meaning that the original bearer of the name lived near a prominent stone or rock.

“GREVE” from the Old French word ‘grave’, meant “grave”. Its English origin refers to a “manager” or “overseer”. In Middle English, it refers specifically to a “farm manager”.

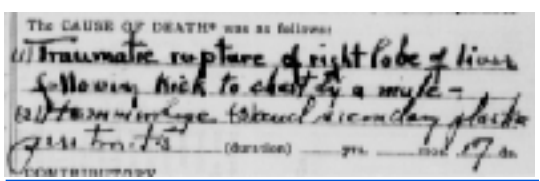

**P**eter Bernard STEINKE was born on June 10, 1893, in Fryburg, Ohio. He was the oldest of nine children born to Stephen Bernard STEINKE and Margaret Gertrude (SCHIMMEL) STEINKE.

Peter Bernard STEINKE married Alvina Mary GREVE on May 6, 1918 in Rhine, Ohio. Alvina Mary GREVE was the fifth of eight children born to Herman Dietrich GREVE and Mary Catherine (WEMPE) GREVE. Alvina Mary GREVE was born on September 27, 1901 in Shelby County, Ohio.

Peter Bernard STEINKE was a farmer at 18751 Reineke-Schipper Road where Peter Bernard STEINKE was a farmer. Peter Bernard STEINKE and Alvina Mary (GREVE) STEINKE had nine children between 1920 and 1933, when Peter Bernard STEINKE died from an accident while shoeing a horse. Three of their children died as infants.

Peter Bernard STEINKE died at St. Rita's Hospital in Lima, Ohio. He suffered damage from to a ruptured liver, caused by a mule kick to the chest or abdomen on June 6, 1933. On June 9, he had surgery, but doctors could not repair the damage. He died on June 24, 1933. He is buried at St. Lawrence Catholic Church Cemetery in Rhine, Ohio. Some time after his death, Alvina and her six living children moved back to the GREVE farm on Botkins Pike, where her mother and brother, Linus GREVE still lived. Alvina rented her farm to Alonzo Nuss for about three years, until Alvina re-married and moved back to this farm. The 1940 Census listed the value of this farm as \$1400.

**Mule's Kick Causes Death**  
Peter B. Steinke, 40, died at St. Rita's hospital at Lima where he had been a patient for two weeks. Steinke died of internal injuries received when he was kicked by a mule at his farm home, three miles northeast of Botkins. He was in the act of taking harness off the mule when it became unruly and kicked him in the side. He was taken to the hospital a few days later and an operation performed. Funeral services were held Monday at the Catholic church in Botkins.

Alvina Mary (GREVE) STEINKE married Franklin J. SCHAUB, on August 11, 1936. Franklin J. SCHAUB was born on March 27, 1912, the eighth of nine children born to George Leopold SCHAUB and Maria Katherine (SCHNEIDER) SCHAUB, from Fryburg. The 1940 Census listed the eighth grade as the highest grade of school completed for both Franklin and Alvina.

The **SCHAUB** surname is from the Middle High German word "schoup," meaning "bundle/wisp of straw." It is likely that the name originally was borne by a miller, or someone who lived near a mill.

Franklin J. SCHAUB was a farmer. After they married, Alvina and Franklin SCHAUB, and her children, moved to the farm that Alvina had been renting out after the death of her first husband, at 18751 Reineke-Schipper Road, Botkins, Ohio.

Alvina Mary (GREVE-STEINKE) SCHAUB had five children with her second husband, Franklin J. SCHAUB, between 1937 and 1944(?). Franklin J. SCHAUB died on July 15, 1989 at his residence. He is buried at St. Lawrence Catholic Church Cemetery in Rhine, Ohio.

Alvina Mary (GREVE-STEINKE) SCHAUB died on February 20, 1994 at the Sunny Acres Care Center in Sidney, Ohio. She was 92 years old. She is buried at St. Lawrence Catholic Church Cemetery in Rhine, Ohio.

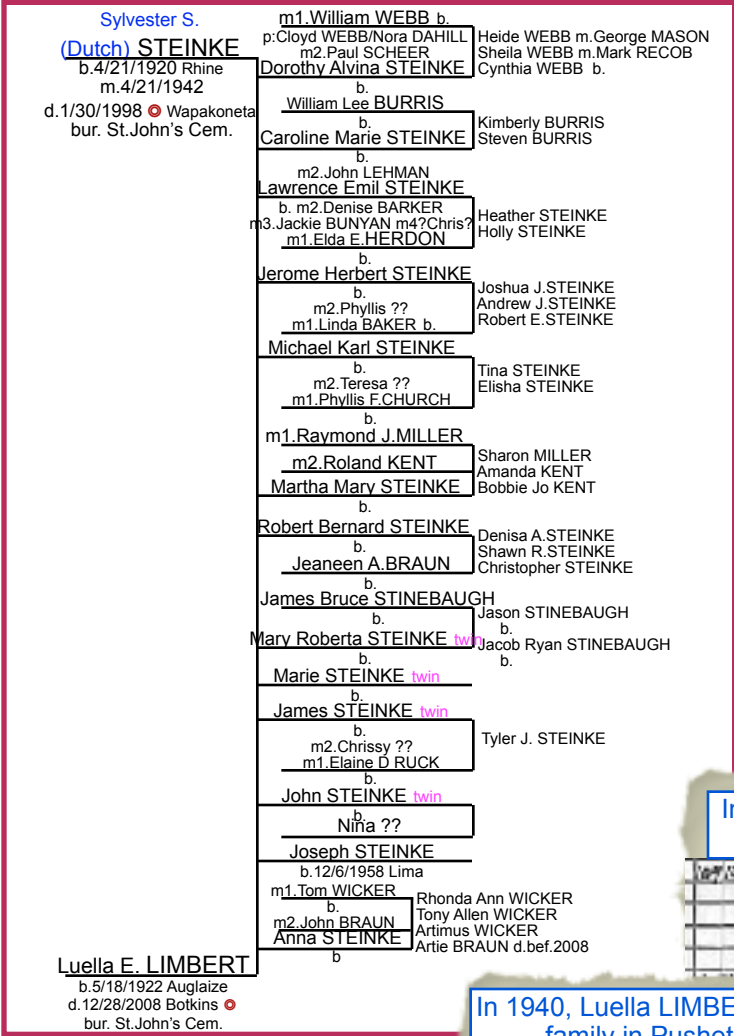

Sylvester S. STEINKE was born on April 21, 1920, in Rhine, Ohio. He was the first of nine children born to Peter Bernard STEINKE and Alvina Mary (GREVE) STEINKE.

Sylvester S. (Dutch) STEINKE married Luella E. LIMBERT on April 21, 1942 in \_\_\_\_\_, Ohio. Luella LIMBERT was a daughter of John A. LIMBERT and Margaret Maria (SCHNEIDER) LIMBERT, of Freyburg. Luella LIMBERT was born on May 18, 1922 in Auglaize County, Ohio. Her brother, Herbert R. LIMBERT married Lorena STEINKE, who was Sylvester S. (Dutch) STEINKE’s aunt. The 1940 Census shows Luella LIMBERT’s highest grade of education as “H-1”, or ninth grade. This is also the highest grade completed by Sylvester S. (Dutch) STEINKE.

Sylvester S. (Dutch) STEINKE was a farmer near Botkins, Ohio. He was also a supervisor with Proviso-Botkins for 35 years. Sylvester S. (Dutch) STEINKE and Luella (LIMBERT) STEINKE had thirteen children between 1943 and 1960, including two sets of twins.

Sylvester S. (Dutch) STEINKE died on January 30, 1998 at his residence on 10622 Rupert Road, Wapakoneta, Ohio. He was 77 years old. Luella (LIMBERT) STEINKE died on December 8, 2008 at her residence. She was 86 years old. Both are buried at St. John’s Catholic Cemetery in Fryburg, Ohio.

Ursula Catherine STEINKE was born on December 5, 1921, in Rhine, Ohio. She was the second of nine children born to Peter Bernard STEINKE and Alvina Mary (GREVE) STEINKE.

Ursula C. STEINKE married Emil J. WACHAUF on June 10, 1943 in Rhine, Ohio. Emil J. WACHAUF was one of four children born to Joseph C. WACHAUF, (a native of Austria), and Lenora C. (HIRSCH) WACHAUF. Emil J. WACHAUF was born on April 15, 1920 in St. Mary's, Ohio. The 1940 Census lists Ursula C. (STEINKE) WACHAUF's highest grade of school completed as "H-1", or ninth grade.

Emil J. and Ursula C. (STEINKE) WACHAUF bought a farm at 02077 Noble Road, St. Mary's, Ohio in 1950, where they were a dairy farmers. Emil J. WACHAUF also worked at the St. Mary's Foundry for 29 years, producing Iron Castings.

Emil J. and Ursula C. (STEINKE) WACHAUF had one child (adopted) in 1959.

Emil J. WACHAUF died on June 27, 2001 at the Joint Township District Memorial Hospital, in St. Mary's, Ohio. He was 81 years old. He is buried at Guthsemene Cemetery, St. Mary's, Ohio.

Ursula C. (STEINKE) WACHAUF died on January 2, 2021 at Otterbein Senior Living Center, in Cridersville, Ohio. She was 99 years old. She is buried at Guthsemene Cemetery, St. Mary's, Ohio.

Elmo Edward HEMMERT was born on May 5, 1919 in Botkins, Ohio. Elmo HEMMERT was a farmer, who also worked for Ferguson Construction in Sidney, Ohio, for 25 years.

Elmo Edward and Ruberta C. (STEINKE) HEMMERT had seven children between 1947 and 1966.

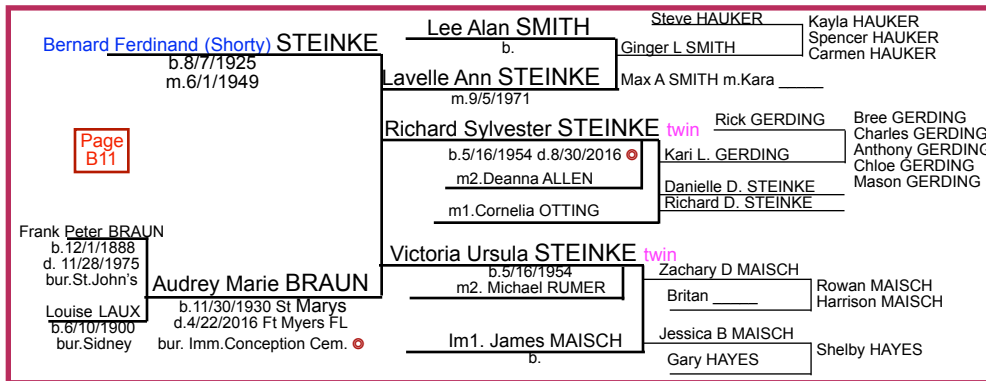

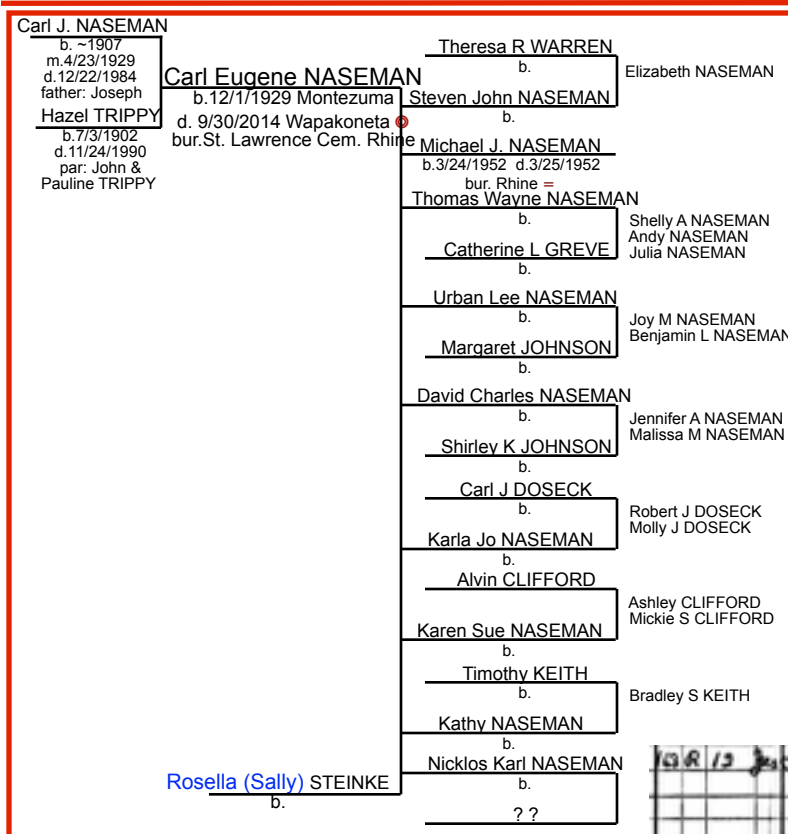

“NASEMAN” is possible derived from NORSEMAN, which referred to the group of people who spoke what is now called the Old Norse language belonging to the North Germanic branch of Indo-European languages, especially Norwegian, Icelandic, Faroese, Swedish and Danish in their earlier forms. The meaning of Norseman was "people from the North" and was applied primarily to Nordic people originating from southern and central Scandinavia.

The 1940 Census - Franklin Twp. Shelby Co., shows Carl NASEMAN in third grade. His family lived at 163 Wiranda Road, U.S. 25., and rented the house for \$12 a month.

parent's farm. He lived on his parent's

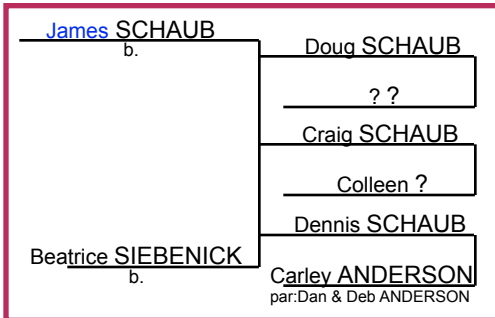
farm in Rhine, Ohio, his entire life with his brother Dave, and continued to farm it after his parent's deaths.

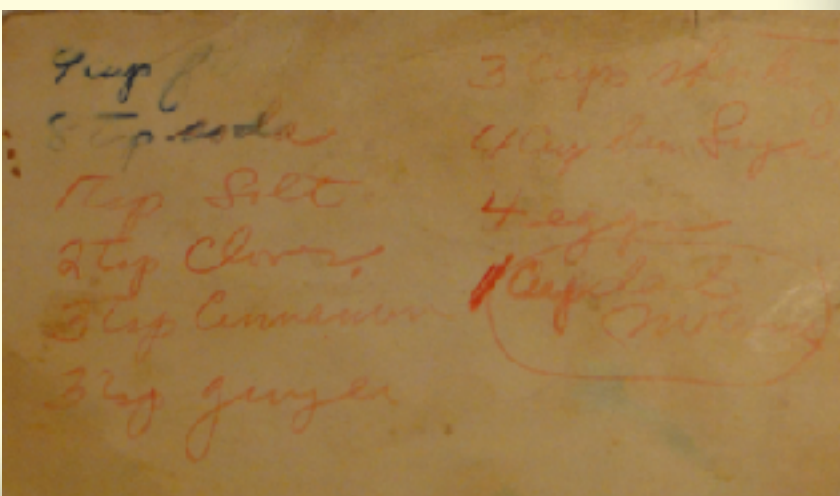
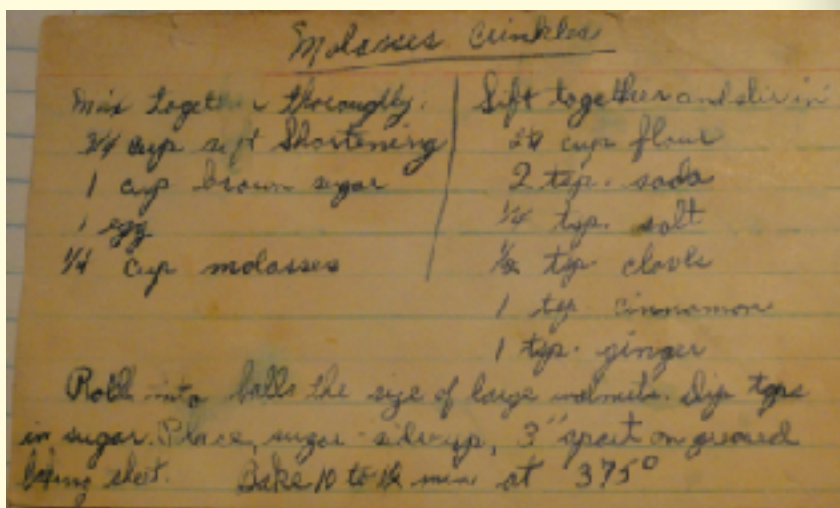
**Molasses Crinkles**

Molasses Crinkles are a popular holiday cookie in the STEINKE & SCHNEIDER families. Here is Sylvia (STEINKE) SCHNEIDER’s recipe.

A large batch (bottom card) is:

- 9 cups flour
- 8 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 tsp cloves
- 3 tsp cinnamon
- 3 tsp ginger
- 3 cups shortening
- 4 cups brown sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 cup dark molasses

This recipe is similar to the traditional *Pfeffernüsse* German molasses Christmas cookies, which are "pepper nut" cookies made with ground nuts and usually dusted sugar. Some recipes actually do contain small amounts of white or black pepper, and either molasses or honey.
